




# Moody Gardens Map





### MEAL PICK-UP

Individuals can pick up their meals using their **conference badge**. All attendees must wear their badge at all times and their meals are linked to their badge. Chapters can not pick up all their meals at once.

# ROOM LISTS

To ensure accountability and compliance with TPSA lodging requirements, all chapters must submit room assignments for their attendees.

**After hotel check-in, advisors must enter the assigned room numbers into their room list in myTPSA by 11:59 PM on March 30th.**

This policy addresses past issues with TPSA's verification of attendee accommodations, which raised safety concerns. Ensuring compliance from all schools helps maintain a safe and organized conference experience.

# VOLUNTEERS

Every TPSA chapter is required to complete two (2) volunteer shifts total. Chapters that fail to complete those shifts or fail to register for those shifts are ineligible to receive awards.

Lunch is provided to all conference attendees on both days regardless if volunteering that day. Breakfast & Dinner will be provided specifically to volunteers if their shift occurs during those meal times.

Chapters that fail to register for or complete both required shifts will be ineligible to receive awards.

## SHIFT SELECTION

Chapter Advisors can view their chapters registered shifts in myTPSA.

Volunteers should check-in at the **Floral Ballroom** at the start of their shift and **check-out** there as well. Volunteers must check-in and out to receive credit.

Competitive event volunteers must complete their entire shift. To ensure fairness, all teams must have the same actors, moderators, managers, etc. throughout the competition. If a volunteer leaves mid-shift, the event may need to be re-run or have its scores cancelled. We understand emergencies arise, but please plan to stay for your full shift.

# VENUE/HOTEL RULES

## General Rules

- No lifeguard will be on duty. Advisors must ensure students follow swimming policies.
- Attendees must wear badges on Marriott property, except during events, at the pool, or in hotel rooms.
- No practicing outside of hotel rooms. This includes but is not limited to hallways, stairwells, parking garages, attractions, gyms, meeting rooms, etc.
- On-site gyms are off limits to students unless escorted by an advisor
- Staff will patrol the hallways after curfew.
- Quiet hours begin at 9 pm. Disruptive activities are prohibited after that.

## Curfew

Students guests must stay in their rooms after curfew, except for medical emergencies, fire alarms, or when with an adult. Advisors will be informed of violations.

- **1st Offense:** The offending students will be placed on probation for the remainder of the conference.
- **2nd Offense:** The students will be disqualified from all events, even if they complete them.
- **3rd Offense:** The entire chapter will be on probation for the remainder of the conference.
- **4th Offense:** The chapter will be disqualified from attending any more TPSA events for the conference.

## Closing Ceremonies

- **Dress Code:** Competitors must wear their CTSO uniform or business attire at the Closing Ceremony.
- **Leaving Early:** To respect attendees, members are asked to stay until the ceremony ends.
- **Housekeeping:** Clean your area before leaving. Dispose of trash and remove belongings. Left items will be discarded.

## Noise Violations

No disruptive noises from TPSA attendees' rooms after 9 pm Violations will be handled as follows:

- **1st offense:** TPSA staff will knock on the door, speak to the occupants, document the room number, and provide a verbal warning.
- **2nd offense:** TPSA staff will knock, speak to occupants, document the violation, and notify the advisor. Any competitor present will face probation for the conference's duration.
- **3rd offense:** TPSA staff will knock, speak to occupants, document the violation, and notify the advisor. Any competitor present will be disqualified from events, regardless of completion status.

Hotel staff will call TPSA if there are complaints at the front desk. This applies to all TPSA-contracted hotels.

## Dress Code

TPSA reserves the right to enforce stricter dress code requirements when students participate in TPSA-sponsored events.

### Examples

- Must wear a cover-up over swimsuits when traveling to and from the pool. No towels as cover-ups.
- No one may go shirtless inside the hotel.

### Students attending the Student Social

- Should not wear excessively tight or excessively loose clothing (I.E. sagging)
- Shirts may not reveal the midriff or be low cut.
- Shorts and skirts may not reveal any portion of the buttocks/undergarments.

Students not following dress code guidelines must leave the event and return only when properly clothed.

# COMPETITION RULES

All state competitive events will adhere strictly to TPSA policies outlined in the bylaws, code of conduct, competition rulebook, and individual event guidelines, ensuring fairness and integrity throughout the competition process.

## Eligible Competitors

High School Public Service students who have competed at a 2026 Regional Competition, placed 1st, 2nd, or 3rd in the respective events, and scored at least 60 points are eligible to participate in state-level competitive events. Students are limited to participation in two competitive events.

**Check-In:** Competitors must check in to their event at their designated check-in time. Competitors who arrive ten (10) minutes after their designated check-in time **will be marked as no-shows** and not be allowed to compete out of respect for the time commitment made by our judges and volunteers. Events can run ahead or behind, check the online schedule or monitors.

## Awards

Medals are awarded to 1st place, 2nd place, and 3rd place competitors for each competitive event. Each winning entry or team will receive a trophy to be displayed at their school, symbolizing their collective excellence and teamwork.

The presentation of awards is an integral part of closing ceremonies at the State Conference. It is highly recommended that all participants and advisors attend the ceremony to celebrate the achievements of all involved. If you choose to leave the conference before the award ceremony, you will be responsible for any shipping charges incurred to receive your medals or trophies. Please notify the event organizers in advance if you will be unable to attend the ceremony. Chapters that fail to complete their volunteer requirements are ineligible for awards.

## Scoring and Placements

The Texas Public Safety Association (TPSA) aims to provide a fair and transparent scoring system to ensure the integrity and credibility of our competitions. Judges' scores will be averaged to determine each competitor's final event score. Ties are not allowed for a numerically scored event. In the event of a tie, judges are required to review and adjust their scorecards to break the tie. The revision should be based on the team or individual's overall performance, paying close attention to aspects like adherence to safety protocols, accuracy in executing tasks, professionalism, teamwork, and communication. Under no circumstances should ties be broken based on time. All options must be exhausted to break a tie, in the event that a tie is still unable to be broken the Competition Governance Team for that conference must approve a tied placement.

## Substitutions/Drops

TPSA has an emergency substitution policy for team events, allowing substitutions up to five days before competition in cases of valid emergencies (e.g., not for grades). Substitutes must be active, paid TPSA members and approved by the Executive Council. Substitutions are not allowed for individual events, and teams must forfeit if a member is removed after the deadline. For State Competitions, no more than 50% of a team may be substituted, and substitutes must have competed at regionals in a different event. Emergency substitution requests are only considered after registration closes.

The drop policy allows teams to compete with fewer members than registered, provided they meet the minimum required for the event. For specific events like Felony Traffic Stop and Facility Design, teams can compete with fewer registered members as long as the minimum is met. For other team events, a one-member deficit is allowed for teams of three or more, but teams of two or fewer cannot compete if a member is removed without a valid emergency substitution.

## Electronic Devices

The TPSA Electronic Device Policy permits cell phones and smart devices only within designated general event-holding areas. Devices are strictly prohibited in all competition rooms, hallways, restrooms, and parking areas where events are visible. Cameras may only be used in events explicitly requiring them, and all event-related images must be cleared from devices before exiting the event area. All violations of this policy will result in immediate disqualification.

## Searching and Handcuffing

TPSA competitors performing handcuffing and systematic searches must follow guidelines prioritizing safety, ethical conduct, and adherence to law enforcement standards. Participants must receive proper training and supervision before using handcuffs, always employing minimal necessary force. Searches must be respectful, methodical, and compliant with established procedures, and failure to complete required searches will result in point deductions. Violations of these policies may result in disqualification and additional disciplinary action. Please reference the TPSA rulebook for complete definitions about searching and handcuffing.

## Event Safety

TPSA prioritizes the safety of all competitors and actors in role play scenarios, requiring strict adherence to event safety procedures. Any injury caused by negligence, rule violations, or deliberate actions will result in immediate disqualification and potential further sanctions. Investigations will be conducted for all reported injuries, with final decisions made by TPSA officials and the Executive Council. The use of pressure points or techniques intended to cause harm is strictly prohibited and will lead to disqualification.

Competitors must review and adhere to all safety dress code guidelines outlined in their event documentation before check-in. These guidelines ensure clear communication, minimize confusion, and address event-specific safety requirements.

## Secret Scenarios

The scenario is a secret topic. Professional ethics demand that competitors DO NOT discuss or reveal the secret topic until after the conference has concluded. Violation of the ethics rules will result in disqualification and revocation of Texas Public Safety Association membership.

## Photo Identification

To ensure the integrity of our competitive events, the Texas Public Safety Association (TPSA) requires all competitors to present a valid, original, and current photo ID for admission to their competition events. This policy outlines the acceptable forms of identification and the requirements for each.

### Competitors may use any of the following forms of ID:

- A government-issued driver's license or non-driver ID card or passport.
- An official school-produced student ID card from the school the competitor currently attends. The ID must be for the current or previous academic year and in a hard plastic card format.
- Members may upload a profile picture to their myTPSA account before their regional competition. If a competitor has uploaded a profile photo to their myTPSA account, this photo will be accepted as a valid form of identification. No printed copy is required. No uploads may occur after regional competition registration closes.
- If none of the above forms of ID are available, the TPSA Competitor Identification Form may be completed and used.

### All forms of ID must meet the following requirements:

- The first and last name on the ID must match the name used on the competition event registration.
- The photo on the ID must be current and recognizable.

Competitors who do not present an acceptable form of ID as outlined above will not be eligible to compete.

New Student Board Members will be sworn in during the Closing Ceremonies.







# GRIEVANCES



Grievance Deadline is **11:59 PM on Wednesday, April 1st.**

We understand that situations can arise where you feel a decision, action, or condition during the competition is unfair or goes against TPSA rules. That's why we've established a clear and formal grievance process, so you have a structured and respectful way to advocate for yourself or your team. However, let us be very clear: this is the **only** way to address such concerns. Approaching staff, judges, or event personnel directly to express your dissatisfaction outside of this process is not permitted.

If you wish to file a grievance, it must be submitted through the myTPSA portal by the official deadline of **11:59 PM on Wednesday, April 1st.** Grievances submitted in any other way will not be accepted. Once a grievance is received, the Competition Governance Team will review its validity and notify the party involved. This will be followed by a formal hearing, where all evidence will be carefully examined. A final decision will then be made and communicated to all parties.

Because grievances are time-sensitive, particularly during competitions, it is essential to adhere to the posted deadlines. Any grievances submitted late or outside of the prescribed process will not be considered. For detailed instructions on how to file a grievance, please refer to the TPSA Grievance Guide.

This process is in place to ensure fairness and professionalism for all participants. Thank you for following these procedures and helping us maintain the integrity of our competitions.

# GET INVOLVED

# Crime Scene to Classroom

July 21-24, 2026  
Huntsville, TX



The Institute for Forensic Research, Training and Innovation at Sam Houston State University will host “Crime Scene to Classroom” as part of its 2026 Forensic Science Educator Training program. The four day training program will be held in Huntsville, TX.

The conference is designed to provide instruction to middle school and high school educators. This is an intermediate level course, designed for educators that have some familiarity with the topic.

“Crime Scene to Classroom” is a laboratory and field-intensive course. Attendees are expected to complete required reading ahead of the training in order to participate in the hands-on activities over four days.

Participants will work in teams to process a crime scene and collect evidence from a human cadaver. After processing the scene and collecting evidence, each team will complete in-depth laboratory analysis using techniques and instrumentation that is routinely used in the crime laboratory. Intensive laboratory exercises completed over the four days cover:

- **Forensic DNA**
- **Forensic Toxicology**
- **Controlled Substance Analysis**
- **Trace Evidence Analysis**

## Goals

- Learn how the scientific method is applied to both the recovery of evidence from the scene of the crime and subsequent laboratory testing
- Hands-on use of scientific instrumentation currently used in crime laboratories
- Gain experience using DNA sequencers, GC-MS, polarized light microscopy and extraction techniques
- Students will collect, analyze and present their case findings in teams
- All attendees will be provided with the analytical data and resources from each of the crime scene teams for use in their own classroom
